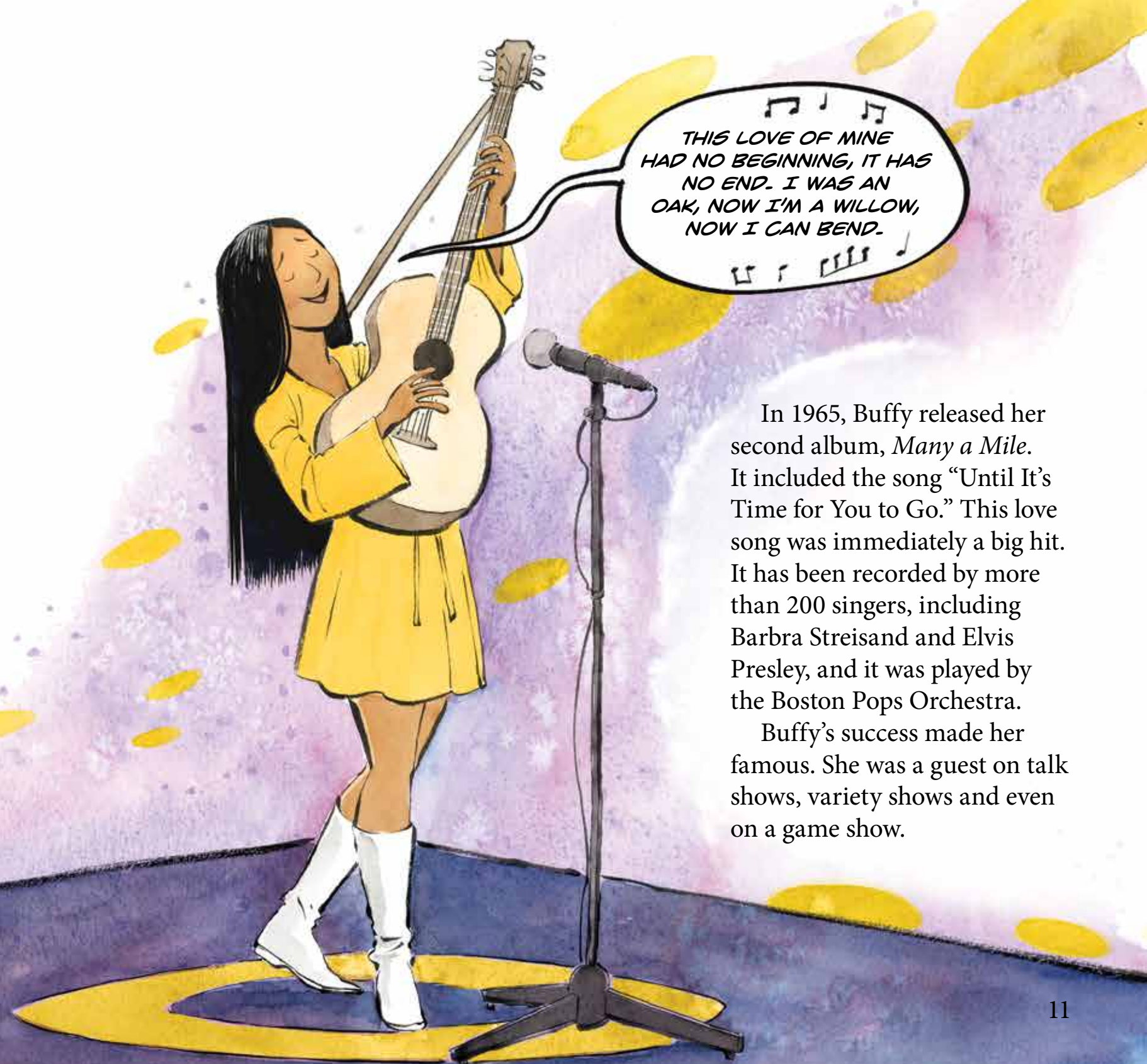




In 1962, Buffy was flying to Toronto to play a show. At the airport she saw a group of wounded American soldiers. They had been fighting in Vietnam, a country in Southeast Asia. What Buffy saw saddened and horrified her.

When she arrived at the coffee house, Buffy sat down and wrote "Universal Soldier." This antiwar song was on her first album, *It's My Way*. Buffy sang about how everyone had a responsibility to try to stop wars. It became a famous protest anthem.



In 1965, Buffy released her second album, *Many a Mile*. It included the song "Until It's Time for You to Go." This love song was immediately a big hit. It has been recorded by more than 200 singers, including Barbra Streisand and Elvis Presley, and it was played by the Boston Pops Orchestra.

Buffy's success made her famous. She was a guest on talk shows, variety shows and even on a game show.
