

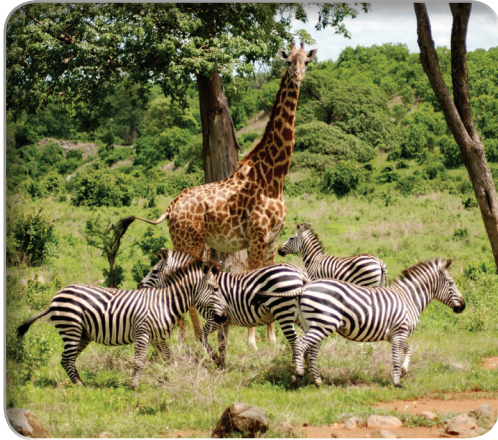

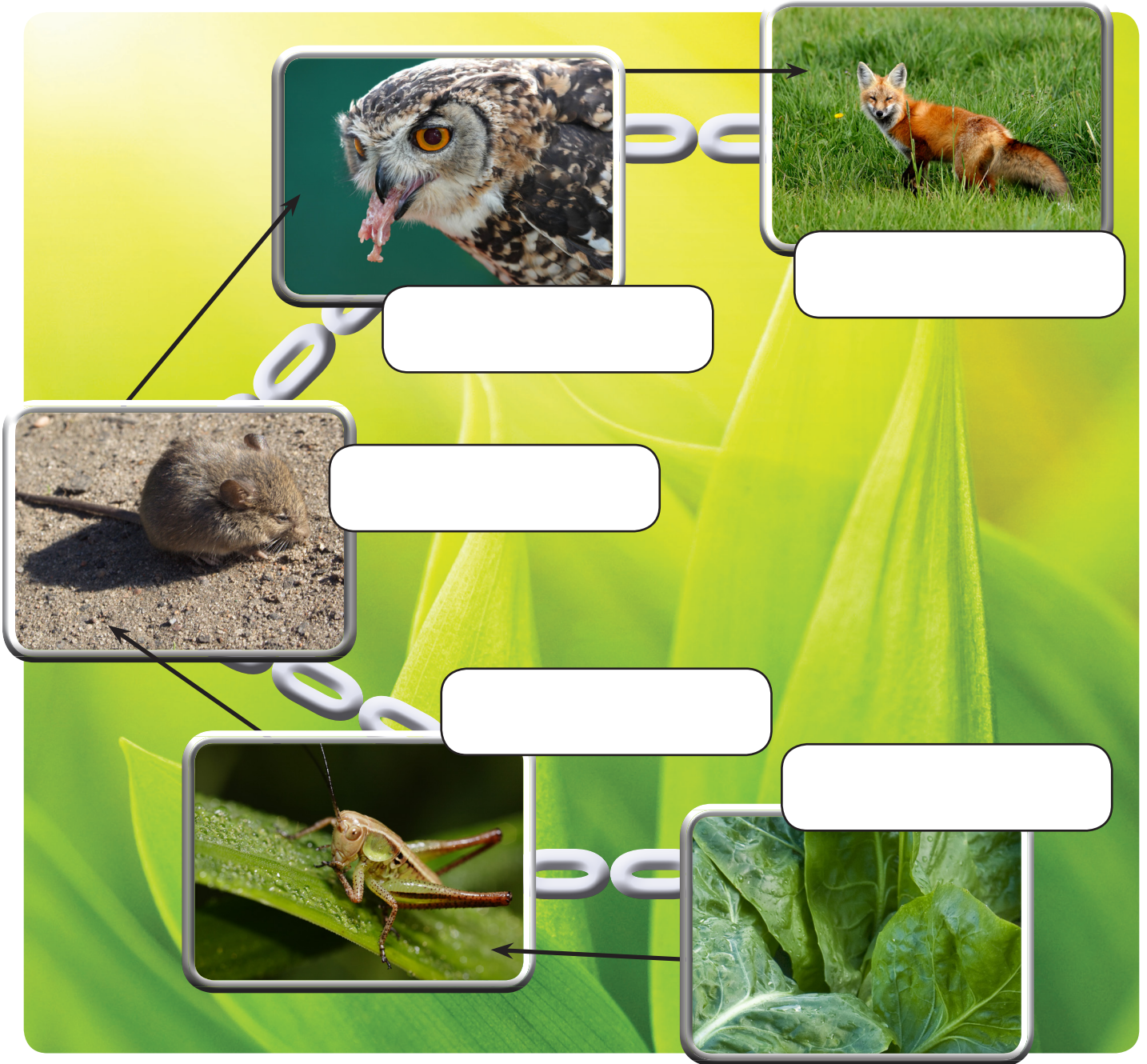

Food Chains



Concept: Each food chain starts with a producer and ends with a consumer.

What You Need:

- white paper cut into strips
- pencil, pen, or marker
- stapler

What You Do:

- Write a name of a plant, insect, bird, or animal on each strip.
- Take a strip with a plant name written on it.
- Make the strip into a circle and staple the ends together.
- Choose a strip with something on it that eats that plant.
- Combine this strip with the plant circle to start a chain.
- Continue the chain until you end up with the final consumer.
- Make similar chains with your other plant and animal strips.

What You Should Notice:

All chains start with a plant and end with an animal, but some are longer than others.

Explanation:

Pick one of your food chains. Explain how energy passes from the producer to the last consumer in this food chain.
